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PSC Elects New Officers

The Public Service Commission of South Carolina has elected new officers. John E. "Butch" Howard of Charleston (1st District) was named Chairman and David A. Wright (2nd District) Vice Chairman. Upon his appointment as Chairman, Commissioner Howard stated, "I am looking forward to working with this group of commissioners and drawing on the experience of the three past chairmen who continue to serve on the Commission." In addition to his South Carolina Commission duties. Commissioner Howard is a member of the National Association of Regulated Utility Commissioners (NARUC), where he serves as Chair of the Committee on Water.

As Vice Chair, Commissioner Wright will assist the chairman with the Commission's operations and the

We are recognized as a leader in the resurgence of nuclear generation made possible by the Base Load Review Act of 2005.

In June, we welcomed Nikki Hall as our newest commissioner, representing the 6th District, and in July, Jocelyn Boyd was named Chief Clerk. In her role as Chief Clerk, Jocelyn brings to the Commission fresh, new ideas and her dedication and enthusiasm.

In November, Commissioner David Wright was named First Vice President of NARUC. The recognition and exposure this office brings to our Commission is tremendous. Congratulations, David!

And to close out the year, we had a celebration recognizing our 100th anniversary. Many former commissioners and staff were on hand to help us celebrate this momentous occasion. It was truly a special day.

I am thankful and appreciative of the continuing support of my fellow commissioners, our staff, the Public Utilities Review Committee and the Office of Regulatory Staff in carrying out our mission: To regulate the state's investor owned utilities through a fair, open, and effective process.

Commissioner **David A. Wright** was elected by his peers as First Vice President of NARUC. At the conclusion of the NARUC Annual Meeting on November 17, 2010, in Atlanta, Commissioner Wright was installed into office. He will serve in this capacity until next November. As first vice president, Commissioner Wright will serve on the NARUC Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, and assist the president in providing general oversight of the Association.

"I am incredibly honored and humbled to become First Vice President of this prestigious organization,"



Commissioner Wright said. "I value deeply the confidence my fellow regulators have placed in me, and I will do all I can to represent them going forward. As regulators of essential utility services, our jobs touch the pocketbooks of most Americans. I look forward to working

with my colleagues as we maintain and improve upon the regulatory compact."



Congratulations to Commissioner Elizabeth "Lib" Fleming on her appointment to the Eastern Interconnection States Planning Council (EISPC). Commissioner Fleming will serve as the Council's secretary and as a member of

the Executive Committee, representing the interests of the southeastern states. As a member, Commissioner Fleming will participate in meetings and strategic planning activities to discuss electricity transmission for the Eastern Interconnection, which includes thirty-nine states, Washington, DC, New Orleans, LA, and a number of Canadian provinces. According to Commissioner Fleming, "The data and information collected during this process will be used to make good policy decisions for years to come." She is also a member of the Eastern Interconnection Planning Collaborative's (EIPC) Stakeholder Steering Committee which provides strategic guidance on the transmission planning studies being performed by the EIPC Analysis Team.

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Ex Parte Workshops and Briefings Enhance Education

The Commission's calendar has been busy this last half of the year with several requests for allowable ex parte briefings. These briefings provide a forum to present information to the Commission on pending cases or emerging issues while following legal procedures for communications among parties.

Topics ranged from emerging and foundational issues within the electric and gas industries to the US Nuclear Infrastructure Council's update

These workshops and briefings allowed for dialogue between the parties through informational presentations, followed by discussions, and question and answer sessions. All parties benefited from the exchange of information.
